PURPOSE.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets forth the terms and understanding between Government Degree College, Sector -9, Basai Road, Bhawani Enclave, Gurgaon (hereinafter referred to as "the College") and Foundation for Community Development and Health Care in India (hereinafter referred to as "the FCDHCI") for the purpose of executing a volunteer engagement program for the College's students in the activities of the FCDHCI.

OBJECTIVES.

Volunteer Engagement: To engage students of the College in various community development and health care activities organized by the FCDHCI from time to time. Prior information about volunteering opportunity will be given to the contact person of college by representative of FCDHCI.

Skill Development: To provide students with practical experience and skills in community service and health care.

Community Service: To foster a spirit of volunteerism and social responsibility among students.

SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES.

Volunteer Activities: Students will participate in activities such as health camps, community outreach programs, awareness campaigns, and other initiatives led by the FCDHCI from time to time. No honorarium or payment of any sort will be paid by FCDHCI to the volunteer for participating in the activities.

Training and Orientation: The FCDHCI will provide necessary training and orientation sessions required for community health services to the students placed for volunteering purpose.

Supervision and Support: The FCDHCI will ensure adequate supervision and support to the student volunteers during their engagement.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

The College- Government Degree College, Sector 9, Gurgaon.

- > Identify and encourage students to participate in the volunteer engagement program of FCDHCI.
- > Coordinate with the FCDHCI to schedule activities and ensure student participation.
- > Provide necessary academic support to students to balance their volunteer commitments and academic responsibilities.

Foundation for Community Development and Health Care in India.

- > Offer meaningful volunteer opportunities aligned with community development and health care objectives.
- > Conduct training sessions and provide materials required for the activities.
- Ensure the safety and well-being of student volunteers during their engagement.

DURATION.

This MOU will commence on 1 July 2024 and will remain in effect until 31 Mar 2027, unless terminated by either party with 30 days' written notice.

REVIEW AND EVALUATION.

Both parties agree to meet periodically to review the progress of the volunteer engagement program and make any necessary adjustments to ensure its success.

CONFIDENTIALITY.

Both parties agree to maintain the confidentiality of any information shared during the course of the program, except as required by law.

INDEMNITY.

Government Degree College, Sector 9, Gurgaon agrees to indemnify, keep indemnified, and hold harmless the Foundation for Community Development and Health Care in India (FCDHCI), including its officials, against all civil and criminal liabilities, demands, and/or claims of any kind during the course of volunteering programme. This includes claims for non-compliance with applicable laws, rules, regulations, and guidelines, as well as any losses, damages, or expenses suffered or incurred by Government Degree College, Sector 9, Basai Road, Gurgaon in connection with this volunteer engagement program. Under this agreement, the liability of FCDHCI is limited solely to providing volunteer opportunities to the students of Government Degree College, Sector 9, Gurgaon.

TERMINATION.

Either party may terminate this MOU with 30 days' written notice to the other party. Upon termination, both parties will work together to ensure a smooth transition and completion of any ongoing activities.







also enrich the students' personal and professional growth.









