The event aimed to explore the rapidly growing impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and its intersection with cybersecurity, focusing on safeguarding the digital future and understanding how technology is reshaping modern education and data protection.

Mr. Purshottam Sharma, certified professional in Data Protection Fundamentals (IBM) and Project Management (Google) delivered a comprehensive and thought-provoking session on the significance of Artificial Intelligence in enhancing cybersecurity frameworks. He explained how AI tools can detect threats, identify vulnerabilities, and respond to cyberattacks more efficiently than traditional systems. The speaker also highlighted the challenges posed by AI-driven cyber threats, emphasizing the importance of ethical AI, responsible innovation, and the role of professionals in maintaining data privacy and digital trust. His engaging examples from real-world cybersecurity scenarios kept the audience captivated throughout the session. Students were encouraged to develop digital literacy, critical thinking, and awareness about safe online practices. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A segment where students enthusiastically asked questions regarding cybersecurity careers, AI advancements, and data protection laws. 60 students participated in the session.
